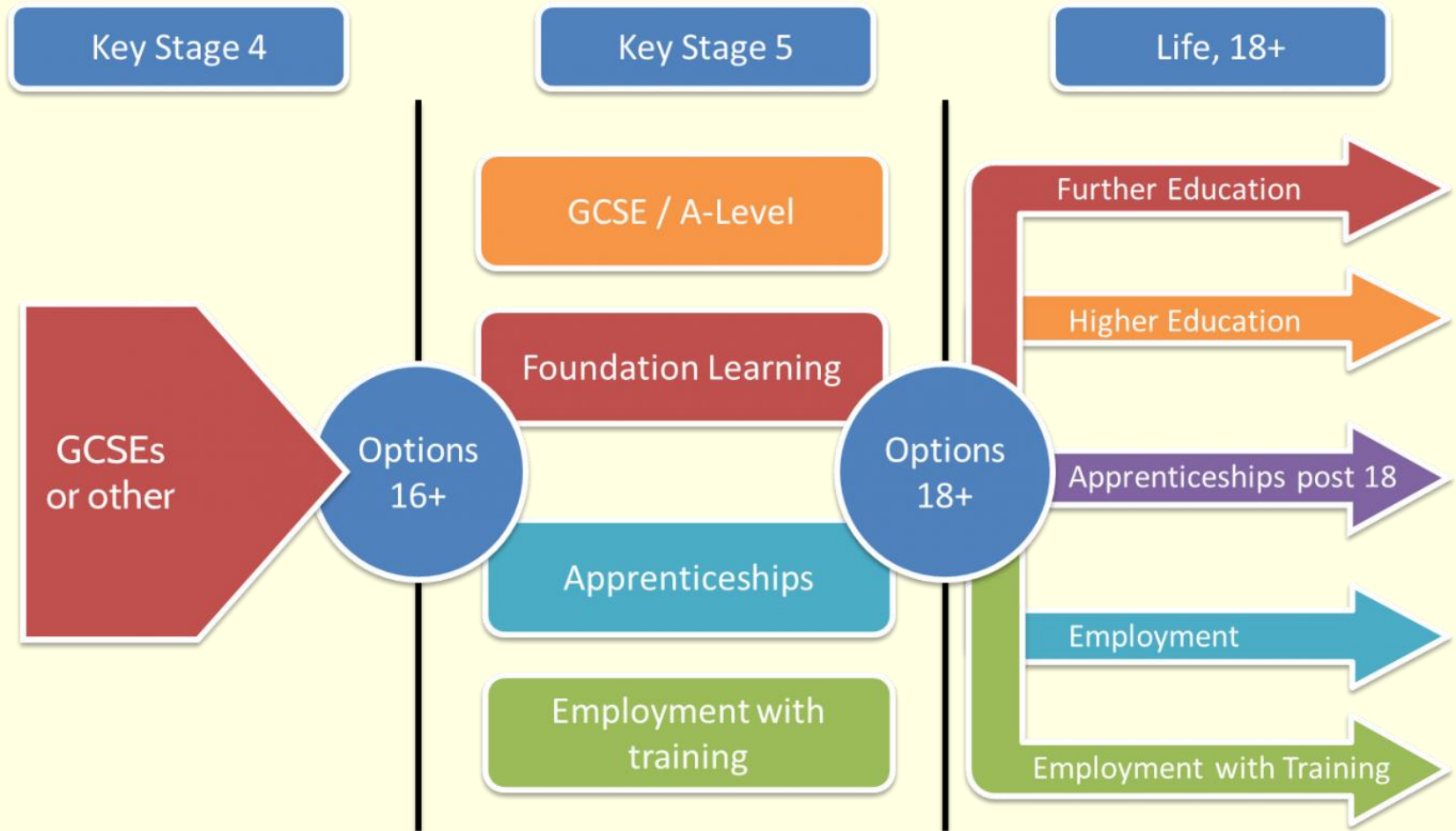

The results in 2020 were issued based on teacher evidence.

- 99.4% overall pass rate.
- 99.3% in A-Levels & EPQ
- 100% in BTEC courses.

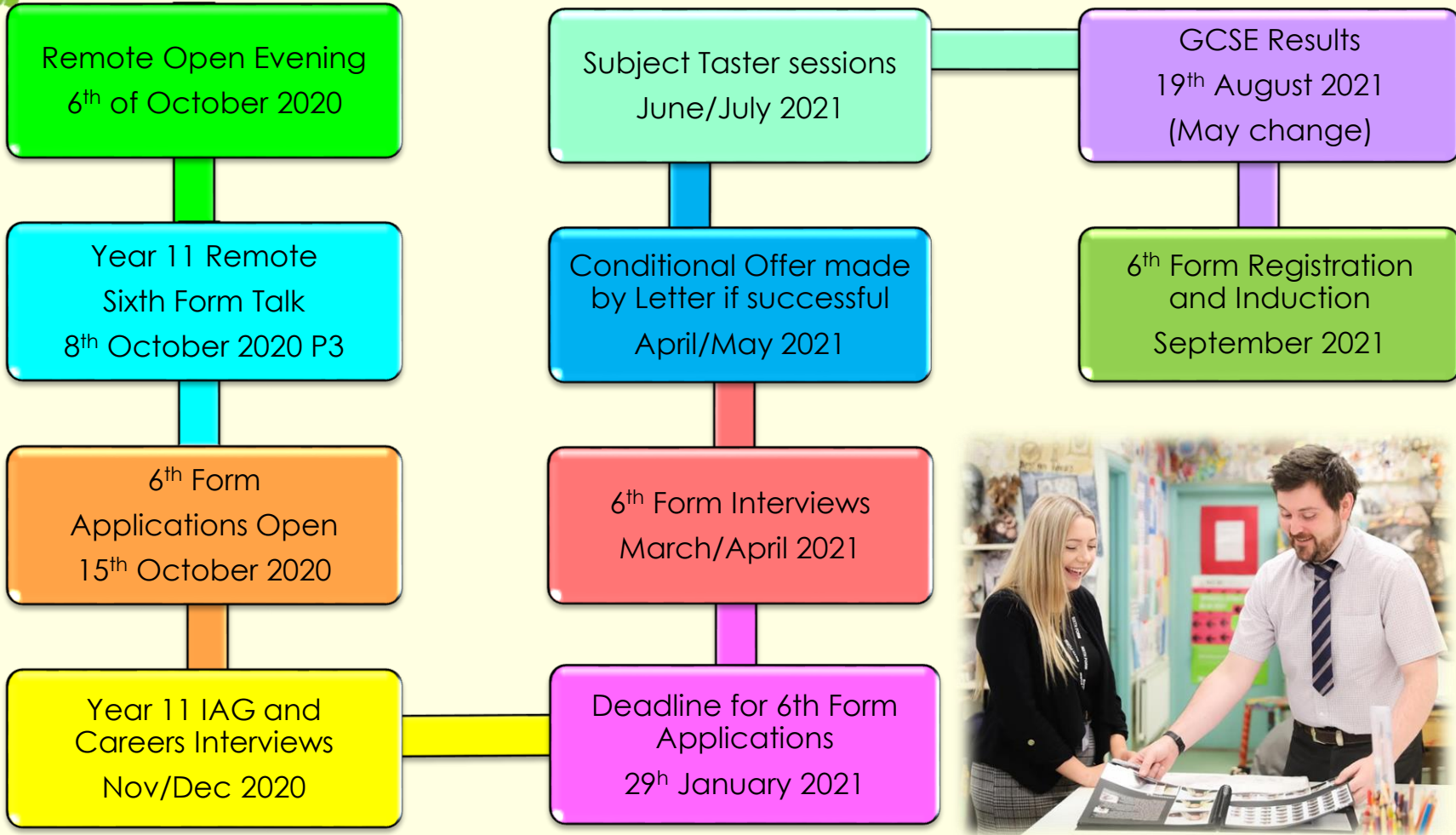
1. **Subject/Head of House/tutor Recommendations**
