What Parents and Ofsted said about our pastoral systems


- •The school's **strong house system** ensures that staff are acutely aware of the needs and interests of individual pupils and work very effectively to ensure their welfare and security.

Incidents of bullying are rare, and staff deal with them effectively when they arise.

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Induction Period

Year 9 students undergo an Induction Period in September

We are looking to celebrate success in relation to:

- Attendance = 96%
- Behaviour = NO referrals
- Progress = all teachers will be consulted

If students are not successful in these first 4 weeks, they have 3 further weeks in order to be successful.



Our school uniform

- As you are aware we have a straightforward, smart school uniform. Not infrequently visitors to the school comment on how smart our students look. We expect our students to wear their uniform with pride
